Partner Questions Arising from LIFT's Call for Proposals: Safe Migration and Empowerment for Migrant Women in Urban Centres

First batch of questions (as of 7th October 2016)

1	<p>In reference to the call for proposals for the 'Safe Migration and Empowerment for Migrant Women in Urban Centres' projects, is a private sector company eligible to bid?</p> <p>Yes, please refer to the LIFT operating guidelines: "Eligible implementing partners include the Government of Myanmar, international and national non-governmental organisations, United Nations agencies, other international organisations, academic or research institutions and private sector companies." http://www.lift-fund.org/guidelines</p>
2	<p>We need to know if the newly formed association can apply for the grant or you have capacity building grants to build capacity of such organisations. We have less than 7 month operating and we are interested to apply for this call.</p> <p>Please refer to Answer 1.</p>
3	<p>In Annex I of the Call for Proposals document, it states that "Costs incurred at headquarters outside Myanmar will be only considered in exceptional cases." Could you clarify that if the applicant's indirect costs consist solely of its HQ costs, would the applicant still be able to include indirect cost of no more than 6% in the proposal?</p> <p>The maximum indirect cost is 6% as per LIFT Operational Guidelines. Cost incurred at headquarters outside Myanmar will be only considered in exceptional cases and need to be directly attributable to the project.</p>
4	<p>Is there an expected minimum and maximum budget amount for awards?</p> <p>There is no minimum budget. The maximum budget for this CfP is USD 4 million.</p>
